Four of the five judges were named today by the Tri-City Junior Chamber of Commerce for the second annual beauty pageant to be held June 17 in the Leaksville high school auditorium.

Heading the panel of judges for the contest is Mayor George D. Lentz, of Winston-Salem. Others on the panel include Smith Barrier, Sports Editor of the Greensboro Daily News; Gowan Caldwell, News Editor of the Winston-Salem Journal, and Norman Gordon Jr., leading bass soloist of the Metropolitan Opera association and director of North Carolina Music Foundation Chapel Hill. Miss Libby Smith, 18, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. A. J. Smith, of Highland Drive, was crowned "Miss Tri-City of 1949" at the second annual beauty contest sponsored by the Tri-City Junior Chamber of Commerce last Friday night in Leaksville high school auditorium.

Miss Smith was selected from a field of 27 contestants and will represent the Tri-Cities in the Miss North Carolina pageant which will be held at Morehead City beginning on Thursday, July 7, and continuing for three days. From 15 to 20 entries from various communities in the state will compete in this pageant and the winner will represent North Carolina in the Miss America contest to be held in Atlantic City in September.

Miss Ash Lee Greer and Miss Virginia Rickman tied for second place at the local show. Miss Greer and Miss Rickman won runnerup positions in last year's contest.

The new queen was crowned by Miss Montine Bondurant, who was "Miss Tri-City of 1948" and who made a splendid showing in the state pageant at Wrightsville Beach last July.

Jack Ormond, president of the Jaycees, presented trophies to Miss Smith, Miss Greer and Miss Rickman. Herb Clarke was master of ceremonies. Joe King, ventriloquist, entertained. The queen was the guest of honor at a dance that concluded the evening.

PRODUCERS OF TOBACCO WILL VOTE JULY 23

Marketing Quotas For 1950-51-52 Or For 1950 Only Will Be Decided At Election July 23

Saturday, July 23, has been designated by Secretary of Agriculture, Charles F. Brannan, as the date for holding a flue-cured tobacco marketing quota referendum, according to R. R. Bennet, extension tobacco specialist at State college.

Tobacco growers in the six flue-cured tobacco states will vote on whether they approve marketing quotas for 1950, 1951 and 1952; for 1950 only; or are opposed to quotas.

The Agriculture Adjustment Act of 1938 as amended requires the proclamation of a marketing quota whenever it is found the total supply of flue-cured tobacco as of the beginning of the marketing year exceeds the reserve supply level as defined in the act. The 1950 quota will be proclaimed on or about July 1 of this year.

Whenever a quota is proclaimed, a referendum must be held to determine whether growers are in favor of or opposed to the quota. Quotas are in effect only when approved by two-thirds of the growers voting in the referendum. Except for 1939, when they were disapproved by growers, marketing quotas have been in effect on flue-cured tobacco every year since the enactment of the Agricultural Adjustment Act of 1938.

In the last flue-cured referendum, held July 1, 1946, three-year quotas were approved by 97.1 per cent of the growers voting. In North Carolina, 177,500 voted for the three-year quotas, 1,671 voted for one-year quotas, and 2,075 voted against quotas. Total votes in the other states were: South Carolina, 27,481; Virginia, 26,028; Georgia, 17,722; Florida, 4,159; and Alabama, 89.
